Details Pertaining to the Statements

It was the responsibility of Manufacturers Life Insurance Company ("Manulife") to prepare the Manulife Financial Corporation ("MFC") greenhouse gas (GHG) inventory statement in accordance with the WRI/WBCSD GHG Protocol Corporate Accounting and Reporting Standard (including the Scope 2 and Scope 3 updates issued in 2015 and 2011, respectively). It was the responsibility of Manulife to prepare its selected social and governance indicator disclosures in accordance with its own internal data management and reporting criteria for said indicators. This responsibility includes designing, implementing and maintaining a data management system adequate for the preparation and fair presentation of the statements. Manulife is responsible for the fair presentation of its data and information and ensuring that these are free from material misstatements.

Based on the work we performed, it was the responsibility of OmnexFuturepast to express an opinion as to whether the MFC GHG emissions and selected social and governance indicator disclosures as stated by Manulife for the 2024 reporting year were presented fairly in accordance with the agreed criteria.

Description of Work Performed

Omnex Futurepast designed and executed analytical procedures and controls testing on a risk-based approach after reviewing Manulife's reported disclosures. Omnex Futurepast performed the following assessments during the verification:

- 1. Assessment of the geographic and temporal boundaries of Manulife's disclosures.
- 2. Tracing of GHG calculations in the consolidated statements to confirm the accuracy of reported values.
- 3. Review for accuracy of GHG emission factors and calculation methodologies.
- 4. Comparison to the prior-year results of GHG emissions and other disclosures and key input data values.
- 5. Assessment of the reasonableness of assumptions.
- 6. Review of Manulife General Account financed emissions methodology document and assessed its alignment with relevant industry guidance.
- Evaluation of Manulife's General Account process workflow and systems used to measure financed emissions.

The data reviewed were historical in nature.

Limitations, If Any

With respect to Scope 3 Category 15 emissions, Manulife limited its disclosures to listed equity and debt. Disclosed data for this category of scope 3 emissions were based upon 2023 emission-year investee and borrower disclosures which represented the most recent publicly available data.

Modifications, If Any

Manulife's MFC 2024 GHG inventory did not fulfil all requirements for public disclosure listed in the GHG Protocol, Chapter 9, "Reporting GHG Emissions", including:

Emissions data for all seven GHGs separately (CO₂, CH₄, N₂O, HFCs, PFCs, SF₆, NF₃) in metric tonnes and in tonnes of CO₂ equivalent



Conclusions

Except for the modification listed above, and based on our evaluation of the evidence, nothing comes to our attention which causes us to believe:

- That Manulife's disclosures of MFC GHG emissions and select social and governance disclosures for the period from 01/01/2024 to 31/12/2024 are not materially correct and are not a fair representation of its data and information, and
- That Manulife's MFC GHG inventory report for the period from 01/01/2024 to 31/12/2024 (except Scope 3 Category 15) has not been prepared in accordance with the World Resources Institute/World Business Council for Sustainable Development's "The Greenhouse Gas Protocol: A Corporate Accounting and Reporting Standard Revised Edition" (March 2004) as amended in 2011 and 2015.
- That Manulife's MFC Scope 3 Category 15 GHG emissions for the period from 01/01/2023 to 31/12/2023 has not been prepared in accordance with the Partnership for Carbon Accounting Financials (PCAF) "Global GHG Accounting and Reporting Standard for the Financial Industry" (Second edition, 2022).
